#### Winter Weather Procedures

If severe weather strikes, the **first step is to assume that the school is open unless you are informed otherwise.** If we are closed, you will be informed by text message, via school website, Twitter and e-mail by 7.15 at the latest and we will use the same methods to inform you of reopening arrangements. Local radio stations will also be contacted. If snow has fallen and the forecast is poor, we will have a 'rolling' closure where you can pick your child up from a specific time onwards if you are able to - we will let you know if this is happening through the same methods above.

#### Parent Reading

The recent changes to arrangements to the start of the school day have settled in well and the feedback from parents has been positive with far less congestion in and around the school site. Our parent reading sessions remain popular but, given parents are now entering school earlier for these, we are going to change the time at which they finish and a bell will now sound at **9.10am** to signal the end of the session. We request that parents do not leave the session before this time, as this leaves the security of the building vulnerable and a standard time for parents leaving the site means we are able keep the building as safe and secure as possible.

#### School Standards

Earlier this month we received final confirmation of the standards reached by our former Year 6 pupils in the summer of this year. They are below with the national average in brackets:

##### **Pupils reaching the expected standard:**

- Reading: 87% (75%)
- Writing: 90% (78%)
- Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling: 90% (78%)
- Maths: 97% (76%)
- Reading/Writing/Maths combined: 80% (64%)

##### **Pupils reaching the higher standard:**

- Reading: 40% (28%)
- Writing: 23% (20%)
- Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling: 67% (34%)
- Maths: 50% (24%)
- Reading/Writing/Maths combined: 23% (10%)

These excellent results represent the hard work of the children and all of the staff who supported them during their time at the school – well done to all!

### Late Collection of Children and Pupil Safety

Our expectation is that children should be collected by parents and carers promptly at the end of the day. If children are not collected on time, our first priority is to place them in a safe and secure location. For this reason, we are changing the arrangements for late collection from 7<sup>th</sup> January:

-Children who have not been collected at the end of the day will be taken to the school office and will remain there until 3.40.

-If they have not been collected by this time, they will be taken to a room further inside the school building close to the offices of the Headteacher, Deputy Headteacher and Assistant Headteacher where they will wait.

-Upon arrival at school, the parent or carer will be required to come to school reception and they will be taken to where their child is so a safe handover can occur.

We would also like to reinforce the fact that parents should not use entrances from the cube into either part of the building unless permission has been granted by a member of staff present in this area. This rule helps us to keep the building as secure as possible.

A final reminder that if you have a child who was born between 1<sup>st</sup> September 2014 and 31<sup>st</sup> August 2015, it is important that you apply online for your child's Reception place by 15<sup>th</sup> January 2019. For further information and to apply online please visit:

### E-Safety and Safeguarding

It is a key responsibility of parents to monitor and regulate any online activity that their child may be involved with at home. The effects of not doing this can be very serious. For example, the School Nursing team have informed Birmingham schools of a current trend concerning the game Fortnite (which has a minimum age limit of 12) where young people are being coerced into using webcams to share images of themselves removing clothing.

The school takes its safeguarding duty very seriously and if you have any concerns about the safety or well-being of a child, then you must contact the school or the Birmingham Children's Advice Service on 0121-303-1888 in confidence. This number must also be used if you suspect any unlawful or inappropriate contact has taken place with either your child (or other children) online.
